

**ASSESSMENT OF COMBAT READINESS IN

Objectives of combat readiness assessment

The main objectives of combat readiness assessment of the Armed Forces of the Republic of Belarus are:

1. Determining operational capabilities, training levels and morale of military personnel.
2. Identifying weaknesses: studying shortcomings in training and organization for subsequent timely adjustments and improvements.
3. Enhancing interoperability: ensuring that different branches of the armed forces can participate in operations together.
4. Maintaining combat readiness: ensuring that forces are always ready to carry out missions at a moment's notice.

Assessment Methods

Combat readiness assessment in Belarus takes various forms:

1. Exercises and training: ongoing military exercises help simulate real combat situations, helping troops practice tactics and strategy in a familiar environment. It should be noted that all the military staff, both officers and military students, of the BNNU take an active part in such trainings.
2. Inspections and Audits: senior Command conducts assessments of the status of units, including the readiness of personnel and the condition of equipment.

3. Equipment Testing: assessing the operational readiness of weapons and military equipment is vital to ensuring that forces can operate effectively.

Command and Control Structure

The command structure of the Republic of Belarus plays a key role in the assessment process. The Ministry of Defense and officials of the Ministry of Defense of the Republic of Belarus are responsible for planning and conducting readiness. Effective communication and leadership at all levels are essential to ensure that units understand their roles and responsibilities during assessments.

4. Medical training: assessment of first aid skills and actions in emergency situations.
