

COMPARATIVE CHARACTERISTICS OF CUSTOMS CORRIDORS IN THE REPUBLIC OF BELARUS AND THE REPUBLIC OF MOLDOVA

In Belarus, to speed up and simplify customs clearance of goods that citizens import or export for personal use, a “double channel” system is used. The division is divided into red and green channels. This allows for more effective control of the movement of such goods.[2]

Customs "red" and "green" channels are created to effectively manage the flow of goods and passengers across the border. They allow you to separate those who must declare goods from those who do not, thereby speeding up the process and ensuring compliance with customs legislation

The "red channel" at Belarusian customs posts is generally reserved for travelers who need to declare goods that exceed duty-free limits, require additional inspection, or fall into restricted or prohibited categories. If you are in doubt about the correctness of registration or have goods to declare, you should choose the “red channel”. There, your luggage may be inspected more thoroughly and you may be required to pay fees. This control is necessary to comply with customs regulations and prevent the illegal import of goods.[1]

At Belarusian customs posts, the “green channel” is intended for travelers who do not have goods subject to mandatory declaration or customs duties and who fully comply with current customs legislation. It ensures expedited customs control.

To compare the Belarusian “green” and “red” channels, we can take Moldova as an example. In Moldova there is also a “blue” customs clearance channel.

The Customs Service of Moldova has introduced a blue channel for customs clearance, which allows you to freely cross the border without conducting documentary and physical checks according to the definition from the customs code of Moldova, the blue channel for customs clearance is a channel that involves passing through customs control without checking documents and personal inspection, but allowing further selective customs control by cross-checking the information specified in the customs declaration[3]

The Belarusian green channel and the blue channel in Moldova differ only in that in the blue channel there will be a re-check of customs declarations

Also in Moldova there is a fourth type of customs channel, this is the “yellow” channel to summarize, in my opinion, the system of “red” and “green” channels

in the Republic of Belarus is quite optimal, but such diversity in the type of “yellow” and “blue” channels can further optimize the customs control system.

The “yellow” channel is a specially designated place at the points of arrival or departure, intended for the movement by individuals across the customs border in accompanied luggage of goods subject to customs declaration, as well as goods for which declaration is carried out at the request of an individual by submitting an electronic customs declaration (expedited declaration).
